As I reflect upon this past year of ministry at West Nidaros there are a few words that come to mind: foundation, completion, busy, excited.

Foundation: What holds us up and keeps us grounded as a congregation? Even though we found the six support pillars to be rotted in the ground and no longer able to support the sanctuary floor, our ultimate foundation as a people of faith is our confession of Jesus Christ. This is a foundation that does not rot, and will not rust, but is firm and steady and unmoved.

Completion: I am looking forward to the completion of all of the capital campaign projects that began in the fall of 2018. The major one will be the completion of the Heritage Dining Room which we are hoping to re-dedicate in the coming weeks. This spring will begin a few other odds and ends with the outside of the building which should complete all of the projects.

Busy: West Nidaros is a busy place, starting Sunday with worship and Sunday school the busyness of the facility continues throughout the week as many people are engaged in activities here on any given day.

Excitement: Kickoff Sunday this fall was one of the most exciting kickoffs I've ever experienced, as over 100 children began Sunday school, 30 or 40 middle schoolers began confirmation, and anywhere from 20-30 high schoolers come to participate in youth group.

When I look back at this past year, I am overwhelmed by all that this congregation has done for the sake of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We have returned our building to a solid physical foundation, even though our true foundation never wavered. We have seen our community grow as children run the hallways past their parents, grandparents, and great grandparents. I've watched as old and young alike participate in worship together, and I'm overwhelmed by all that God has been at work doing through this little country church.

Monthly Ministry

- Lead children's message on Sundays, except one per month
- Plan and lead Sunday school large group opening each Sunday with Elise or Amy Lofswold leading music.
- Plan and lead Confirmation on Wednesdays during the school year. Pastor Jared, Elise, and I are taking turns leading.
- Plan and lead iFaith with Elise. iFaith is an energetic ministry for 4-6th graders after school 1-2 Wednesdays each month.
- Attend KMA night and visit with the committees meeting
- Write information for The Reporter
- Write a council report
- Communicate with parents and students on facebook, through emails, phone calls and texting on a daily basis
 - Send weekly emails to Sunday school teachers
- Communicate Pastor Jared, Elise, and other people in leadership
- Pastoral care of students and families.
- Planning GIFT Sundays GIFT stands for Growing In Faith Together. GIFT Sundays are for everyone of all ages in the congregation to come and learn together. On GIFT Sundays, instead of parents dropping off their student(s), they join them. There is not regular Sunday school classes on GIFT Sundays. GIFT Sundays have been attended by about 60 people each Sunday. Our GIFT Sundays included making fleece blankets for Project Warm Up, coloring cards to send to people (elderly, shut ins, ill) with Health Ministry, painting ornaments from Color Me Mine, bible lessons, crafts, and a snack.

Seasonal Ministry

- Lead First Communion Workshop for fourth grade students and assist with the Maundy Thursday service when they receive their First Communion.
- Assisted with Senior Recognition Sunday
- Family Ministry Nights planned and lead one in April. GIFT Sundays have replaced Family Ministry Nights.
- 3 year-old First Steps I lead a lesson for our 3 year olds and their parents on the first Sunday of the month. They received a prayer pillow during worship on Rally Sunday. This year's class is a little smaller with four families who regularly attend. The 3 year olds are following the same lectionary Sunday school curriculum as the other classes and participate in the large group opening time. We also sing songs, make crafts, and have great conversations in our class! It's great fellowship time for parents too!
- 3rd grade Bible Sunday lead their Sunday school lesson and teach them how to use their bible. Assist with handing them out during worship. THANK YOU to WELCA for the awesome "Adventure Bible" for our 3rd grade students!
- Confirmation for our 9th grade students with Pastor Jared and Elise –Celebration of Passage service, Who Jesus is to Me projects, and rehearsal. THANK YOU to all those who helped make Confirmation a meaningful experience for our students and their families.
- Elise and I divided graduation ceremonies I went to Baltic's graduation and Elise went to Tri Valley's. We both attended graduation parties.
- NeSoDak Bible Camp for incoming 7th grade Confirmation students for a week in July. THANK YOU to the Women of West Nidaros for paying for this amazing experience for our students!
- Promoting and inviting students to be part of the July and November trips to Horse Creek.

- Planned Vacation Bible School with the Board of Education. This is the second summer we have created our own lessons, crafts, snack, and game based on our theme. This year's theme was "Jesus is the Light of the World."
- Ordered key chains for and lead the Blessing of the Backpacks.
- With the Board of Education, I put together the Sunday school calendar and Elise made it look amazing and put magnets on the back of it, so families can have it on their fridge.

- Give visiting families "The Jesus Storybook Bible"
- Write (a lot of) letters of recommendation for scholarships and jobs
- Attend funerals
- Purchase books, resources, and subscribe to Youth Ministry periodicals to stay current in Faith Formation happenings and changes.

Director of Youth & Family Ministry/Office Administrator Report Elise Hasche

Youth Ministry

- Partner with Jessi to lead iFaith (4-6 grade ministry), once or twice a month. We have been averaging between 18-23 students each time.
- Rotate confirmation teaching with Pastor Jared and Jessi. Families provide meals each week for the students before large group begins. We then move to small group time which parents lead. We end with a large circle prayer. Introduced a new service project to Kids Against Hunger in Sioux Falls this year. We had 50 students, parents, and other members show up to help pack of 6,000 meals!
- 19 9th grade students were confirmation on Reformation Sunday. Thank you to Shirley McCormick and Pat Kayser for helping set up for Celebration of Passage and Kristi Stelter for playing piano!
- Lead High School Ministry weekly in games and lessons.
- Traveled to Rainbow Trail Lutheran Camp in Hillside, CO for a week of backpacking in God's creation with 13 students and 5 adults. Students fundraised through serving multiple breakfasts (including Palm Sunday) and meals, selling wreaths, hosting a Silent Auction, and receiving sponsorships from local business. This was my 5th time doing this trip and my 4th time being able to do the hike. It was a hard one this year but still an amazing experience!
- We are preparing to traveling to Perry County, Kentucky in July 2020 for a week of serving with Appalachia Service Project (ASP). We currently have 20 students signed up!
- 12 7th grade students spent a week at NeSoDak, near Wauby, SD, for a week of Confirmation Camp in July. Thank you to WELCA for paying for these students to go to camp! Next year, we will be going to Shetek Lutheran Ministries in Slayton, MN.
- Lead opening music with our Sunday school students every Sunday. It has been a lot of fun interacting with the younger students in that way.
- Lead music and took pictures for Vacation Bible School.
- Went to Horse Creek in November for the Christmas trip.
- Attended sports events at Tri-Valley and Baltic to support our athletic students.

- Attended graduation at Tri-Valley as well as a handful of graduation parties.
- Assisted with GIFT Sundays and other Faith Formation events as needed with Jessi.
- Staying connected with students and parents through email, texting, Facebook, and Instagram.

Office Administrator

- Create and update worship and announcement slideshow using the program Proclaim. Working on ways to make sure there are second eyes on it before worship to ensure less mistakes.
- Create The Reporter Newsletter each month to keep the congregation informed. Thankful for the ladies who help assemble it every month!
- Will be working with 5J Design to create a new church website in 2020. They are phasing out our current operating system so we will be moving to a more user friendly one in early spring.
- Create weekly publications include worship bulletins, announcements, and the WN Weekly email.
- Continue to keep our Facebook page up to date with announcements, pictures, events, and other informative content.
- Continue to work with Membership KMA to update the membership roll.
- Worked with Local Ministries to move our monthly service schedule to the online tool, SignUp Genius.
- Created mailings and posters for children, youth & family, stewardship, WELCA, and anyone else who needs one. Created a special Christmas EDDM (Every Door Direct Mail) Postcard for residents of Renner & Crooks. Had a lot of positive responses from it!

Other Ministry

- Help lead worship through music and pulpit fill when needed.
- Help with funerals as needed (sound, music, etc).

Worship at West Nidaros is continuing to thrive with now four different styles of worship. 2019 introduced the fourth of these with a blended worship experience, led by the instrumentation of guitar, keyboard, percussion, lighter vocals and a mixed blend of traditional and contemporary songs. Throughout the past year, in addition to the traditional worship style, 20 worship services were led by The Call, four services used the liturgy of "Now the Feast and Celebration", and four services were blended worship. It has been a very exciting year with the upgraded sound system in the Family Life Center allowing for much more efficient set-up and take-down for the members of the Call. It is always my goal to involve more people in the music ministry and to make that involvement as easy and welcoming as possible. I continue to feel grateful and blessed to be a part of the staff and overall ministry that happens at West Nidaros...the place where Christ's love IS shared with all!

The role and primary responsibilities of Director of Music Ministry during 2019 have included:

Worship planning:

ENDOWMENT & MEMORIAL FOUNDATION REPORT

The West Nidaros Endowment & Memorial Board was created to encourage, receive and manage gifts from donors for the enhancement of the mission of West Nidaros Lutheran Church apart from the general operations of the congregation and to insure those gifts are used in accordance with donor wishes and Board policies. The Endowment Board met ten times during 2019, usually on the Wednesday KMA meeting nights at WNLC.

The Board recommended using \$20,500 from the Horizon Fund proceeds to fund Horizon Fund Grants in 2020. Applications for the following grants were received by the Board, reviewed and recommended to and approved by the Church Council:

- 7. WN Altar Guild \$2000 Purchase banner, candle stand and supplies
- 8. WN WELCA \$1000 Purchase food for Harvest Festival Supper
- 9. The Call \$3300 Equipment supplies & repairs
- 10. WN IT Committee \$6600 Upgrade video system

Total approved: \$20,500

Two additional grant applications were received but not funded.

- 1. WN Admin. Team \$7000 Upgrade of Pastor's Office (JR recommends postponing request)
- 2. WN HDR Committee \$4000 -- Help with HDR remodel budget (additional funds may not be needed per CL)

It was recommended that these requests be re-submitted next year if needed.

All but one of the Horizon Fund Grants approved last year were spent in 2019. The \$2500 for the new BB court at Horse Creek was not used.

The Board was asked by the Church Council to review again and update the WN Endowment and Memorial Board Bylaws to fit the recommended format as proposed by the SD Synod Office. The review was completed and the proposed changes were submitted to the Council. They will be presented at the Annual Meeting along with other Constitutional changes.

Thank you to all the members of the Endowment and Memorial Board for their hard work and dedication. Also, a very special "**Thank You**" to the donor families that have made this all possible.

HEALTH MINISTRY ANNUAL REPORT

Mission: to facilitate the healing ministry of the church through professional services, consultation, events, activities and relationships that conveys the love of Jesus Christ to all. We believe that health is a balance of body, mind and spirit, each potentiating the others in a holistic fulfillment of human potential

Health Ministry Team: Mary Brendtro, Deb Whipple, Kristi Hazel, Jill Rye

The Health Ministry team worked to organize health education and provide resources to promote health and wellness.

Austin Oyen provided education regarding medications that promote heart health. He discussed the medications that help control blood pressure and heart problems.

Monthly educational topics were published in the reporter on topics such as heart health, blood pressure, emotional health during winter months, summer heat and heat stroke suicide education Health kits were sent to the Sunday School students at Horse Creek. The kits contained hygiene products for each student who participated in Sunday school in July.

Weekly exercise classes, pickle ball and Stretch and Pray classes are offered multiple times/week for members at all levels of physical ability.

The Health Ministry team hosted a Youth Event on October 2. Confirmation students, high school students and their parents from West Nidaros, Benton, Willow Creek, Baltic and East Nidaros Lutheran Churches participated. Pastor Jared, Pastor Tom and Pastor Randall presented information on God's plan for our lives. Lisa Barlow-Kutter, a behavioral health professional from Avera spoke on the signs of suicide, how to address them in ourselves, identify them in others and how to address the topic of suicide. Myron Nohava from Minnehaha Funeral Home discussed the increase in suicide in our community and devastating impact on families. The event ended with a blessing from Jessi. The Health Ministry team will continue to work with the youth leaders to plan future events. Resources on mental health and suicide have been placed in the hallway near the Pastor's office.

The Health Ministry team will help plan the Gift Sunday, November 10. The theme was kindness. The participants created cards that will be sent to members in the hospital and those who have lost loved ones. Sharon Hoekman has joined the Grief Support Team and will be sending sympathy cards to members of the congregation who are grieving the loss of family members.

REPLICA CHURCH ANNUAL REPORT

The Nidaros Replica Church is a one-third scale replica of the original Nidaros church handcrafted by the late Art Moe, a member of West Nidaros for over 90 years. The structure was moved from the Moe farm to the church grounds in 1993. In 1995 the \$10,000 which Art had designated for the maintenance was placed in an endowment. Later the estate of Leo & Hazel Reppert provided a gift of over \$100,000 to be used for upkeep and maintenance of the replica church. The Reppert gift is invested in the West Nidaros Horizon Fund. The replica committee serves to preserve the heritage represented by the mission and ministry of the Nidaros congregations, forerunners of West Nidaros, but providing for the care and preservation of the replica.

Bill Bunde memorial money was used to replace the aged landscaping around the church, but rock was used instead of wood chips. A memorial rock was also accepted in memory of Bill, Deloris and Troy Bunde placed in front of the replica church.

Summer mowing was done by Robert Oyen, Ken Burke and Vince Hanson. Cheryl Anderson and Kathy Neeb again did an excellent job keeping the church cleaned and polished for viewing and usage. Paraments, chandelier and the wall heater replacement are being checked on. Kathy also met with Elise with information for the updated brochures.

\$150.00 was given to West Nidaros Lutheran Church to cover the annual utilities.

Greetings from your camp - Shetek Lutheran Ministries!

Our theme for summer 2019 was "Transformed Community", with the theme verse "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God....." Romans12:2 We learned how God's love transforms us so we can, with God's help, transform and change our communities for the good. Speaking of change, our community at camp is changing. Kathy Peterson, our Development Director, retired this summer after many years of faithful service and Dana Isaacson, our Program Director, accepted another Program Director position at Camp EWALU in lowa. We are so grateful for their ministry over the years and wish them the best. We will miss them but are looking forward to welcoming new members to our staff community and their ideas and contributions to Shetek's ministry!

During summer 2019, 819 campers experienced Christ centered adventure and learning at Shetek Lutheran Ministries. We continued our Cross-generational programs, which include ABC Camp, Family Camp and Grandparent/Grandchild Camp. This past summer we had two full sessions of our Activities Building Campers (A.B.C.) program for 1st-3rd graders to experience camp for a 24 hour period with their favorite adult (parent, aunt/uncle, godparent, etc.). We again offered Explorer Camp, which included basketball, guitar, arts & crafts, animal adventures, and discovery. The seven sessions of the ever popular Grandparent/Grandchild camp were very well attended this past summer. The Saturday evening services in Christ Chapel continued throughout the summer for a tenth year.

Our \$1.5 million "Building on the Foundation" campaign began this year and has been very well received. Over \$959,000 in cash/pledges have been raised so far this year! We are very grateful for the donors who have provided the support and leadership for the campaign. We plan to begin construction in 2020 on the first project. The congregational phase of the campaign will begin in 2020 and you'll hear much more about our plans and progress when we visit our member congregations.
