Grace and peace to you from God the Father, and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

Romans 5:1-3: "Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through his we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God"

On the last Sunday of the month of October, Lutheran churches around the world take time to remember the reformation of the church through the work of an Augustinian monk named Martin Luther. On the last day of October, Luther went public with his complaints about what the church was doing by nailing his 95 theses to the door of the church in Wittenberg Germany.

Luther's criticism of the church of his day centered on the forgiveness of sins. At this time the church had turned the forgiveness of sins into some that could be bought through indulgences or paid for through works and purgatory. In short, the forgiveness of sins ceased to be the free gift that Jesus Christ gives sinners.

Forgiving sinners, while they are yet sinful, has been the center of the problem, it was a problem for the Pharisees when Jesus did it, and it has been a problem for the church ever since. The problem is this, we want justice in the form of the scales being balanced. But the promise of forgiveness that Jesus gives doesn't balance the scales, it throws the scales out entirely. Which means there isn't anything you can do to earn or deserve forgiveness. It is truly a free gift given to you by Jesus Christ himself. The absolution maybe spoken by your pastor, or your friend, but the words are given by Jesus Christ. The forgiving is done by Jesus alone.

This is what the gospel is, it is the good news that Jesus freely and abundantly forgives sins. Luther knew this to be the center of what the church is and does. The church was established for this work, the work of reconciling sinners with God. Now some 500+ years removed from Luther, and 2000 years removed from Jesus establishing the church, we continue to do the same work, the work of Jesus, the work of forgiving, the work of mercy and grace and giving peace with God. And we will continue this work until the day Jesus Christ returns!



September 24 Congregational Meeting

29 members present

Presented the west basement wall repair plans from Innovative Basement Solutions. After 15% discount the quote is \$54,295.99. Approximately \$16,000 down payment will be needed. Council recommended Innovative because of the extra solid layer of foam applied to the exterior of the wall as well as because they will complete all the work, not subcontract any out. The project will be from the west entrance of the church and proceed south, then east then south to the FLC wall. A new sump pump will be installed in our current pit.

Also presented was an estimate from H&H Paving for re-grading the area between the Sanctuary and the FLC with crushed asphalt to get water away from the buildings. That estimate was \$22,650.

After some discussion, Mike Buchmann made a motion to accept the Innovative Basement Solution and H&H quotes with a cap of \$80,000 in case of unforeseen incurred costs. Second by Jennie Criddle. There was no request for further discussion. A vote was called by show of hands. The motion passed unanimously.
