Time and Talent Sheets-Question was asked which KMA these fall under. Jeff Oyen stated it is under Stewardship and they are continuing to work with the computer program to gather the information needed.

New Business

Sound system: Pastor Jared shared that there are problems with our sound system and he asked a friend to look at it. His friend referred us to Midstates Audio. Midstates Audio advised that the sanctuary needs to be completely re-done to correct our issues. They will give us a bid for the sanctuary audio and their recommendation to correct the problems. They will break down the bid into smaller sections so we can undertake one area at a time.

Darin Larson on behalf of IT reported that their goal is to start recording our Sunday services and putting them on the church website. Recordings will also be available to bring to shut ins. A grant has been approved through the horizon fund in the amount of \$7500 to support the audio upgrade.

Health Ministry is starting pickle ball at West Nidaros.

Bob Carlson ask about keeping moisture out of the building. Jason Carls reported that the gutters will need to be cleaned more often. Concrete will be put in at a slant so moisture runs away from the building.

Pastor Jared encouraged members to let him know of any visitation needs. If there are other ministries/visions that you would like to see at West Nidaros please let him know so we can start discussing them and reflect on what we at West Nidaros are called to do. In 2017 start dreaming for the sake of the gospel.

FOR YOUR HEALTH: BODY, MIND & SPIRIT

Maintaining a healthy body is often at the top of people's minds. Most of us know about common conditions such as heart disease and strokes. However what if I told you there is another disease out there that often people don't have until it is too late and require life sustaining treatments. This disease is kidney disease. Our kidneys are responsible for filtering waste products and getting rid of extra fluid. When the kidneys fail our body is unable to do this sufficiently. According to the National Kidney Foundation 26 million American's suffer from Chronic Kidney Disease. Early detection and prevention is the key. Some easy tests that can be easily done at a yearly physical by your primary care physician to detect kidney disease include monitoring your blood pressure (high blood pressure is a strong risk factor for kidney disease), conduct a urine test to look for protein (when kidneys fail you can have protein in your urine), a blood test that looks at your creatinine level (looks at the level of waste products), and glomerular filtration rate a calculation completed by your physician (tells how well your body filters waste products). Every year the local Dakota chapter of the National Kidney Foundation completes a free KEEP screening in October that completes some of these common tests for free. Look for more information on the Dakota National Kidney Foundation Facebook Page. Also in June is the Kidney Walk in Sioux Falls. Which raises further awareness regarding this silent disease. Some everyday things that you can do to try to ward off kidney disease include controlling your weight, exercising regularly, keep a balanced diet, quit smoking, drink in moderation, stay hydrated, monitor cholesterol levels, get an annual physical, and know your family history (as sometimes certain reasons for kidney disease are hereditary). A great website to get more information regarding kidney health is www.kidney.org.
